### **FEBRUARY 28, 2021** SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

The second Sunday of Lent always tells the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus. There is the appearance of Moses and Elijah on the mountain. They represent the Law and the Prophets, respectively and connect this story to the people of Israel. Mark's narrative has three of the apostles, Peter, James and John, to witness this supreme mystery of life, the Transfiguration of Jesus. They see Jesus as fully human, praying and then watch as his face becomes altered and his clothes become dazzling white. The Transfiguration is genuinely a mystery of light. The glory of Jesus, the son of God, shines forth, and the light of God is seen in the face of Christ. The Father then proclaims to the astounded apostles, "This is my son, the beloved; listen to him!"

In this season of Lent, we Christians take time to reconnect with God quietly. In the fullness of our humanity, we may intentionally read, pray and reflect as we discover ways to draw closer to God. What would we do with a mystical experience like this? Can we capture it? Can we hold it in our hearts and souls? Will we take the time away from the business of life and joyfully acknowledge God? In trying to be a good disciple of God, many say they find Him in nature. It is through moments such as seaside walks, enjoying the forest, watching our hummingbirds, and loving our children and the people of this world that give us a glimpse of the love of God.

I refer to the light of God as the" Great White Light." It is whiter than any white we have seen on earth. It is brilliantly white but doesn't hurt your eyes. With a mystical experience such as this, we would want to hold on to it, recall it, and share it with others. Listen carefully for the voice of God. He will speak to your mind, heart and soul. I like to say, "Speak Lord, I am listening!"

The revelation of the Glory of God climaxes with a voice from a cloud. I have often described my most difficult times as being under a big dark cloud. It is during these times that I prayed with my very soul. I shared these dark days with friends and loved ones by saying that I had my "work to do." Prayer time became a daily habit. It helped me stay more in the here and now. I did not know what lay beyond the moment of prayer, but there always seemed to be a Presence. No vision, no voice but a spark of God in me and I in Him.

As children of God, we are all called to share the divine life. To get past the dark and heavy clouds in life and go to the light beyond. Though we have never seen our Lord Jesus Christ transformed like this, we have seen the transforming radiance of His presence on the faces of others.

My prayer for all:

Jesus, those who listen to you are always transformed by your word. Even in suffering, you show us the joy of the resurrection and a life transformed by the Holy Spirit.


